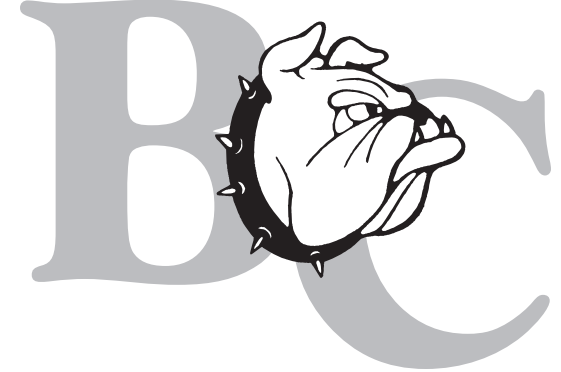

WHO MAY ATTEND

Ages 5-10 are eligible to attend Day Camp sessions. Ages 8 through high school senior are eligible to attend specialty camps. Enrollment is limited, so register early.

FACILITIES

The Barton College Athletic Complex, complete with two full-size baseball fields, an athletic field house, a softball field for the younger campers, and an outdoor batting cage, will be the site of the camp.

SPECIALTY CAMPS

Sessions open to ages 8 through high school senior.

HITTING CAMP (Mon. and Tues.) June 22-23 • 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

The primary focus will be developing a fundamentally sound hitting approach through lecture, demonstration, and practice of the basic hitting mechanics.

INFIELD/OUTFIELD DEFENSE CAMP (Wed. and Thurs.) June 24-25 • 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

Develop fundamentally sound fielding mechanics through lecture, demonstration, and practice.

PITCHER/CATCHER CAMP (Wed. and Thurs.) June 24-25 • 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

This camp will place major emphasis on the development of proper pitching mechanics. All pitchers will learn important aspects of the fastball and change-up. Players 14 and up will be instructed on the proper mechanics of the curve ball. Catchers will receive instruction on receiving, blocking, throwing, and other intangibles required of the catching position.

DAY CAMP (Mon.-Thurs.) June 22-25 • 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

The purpose of the Barton College Baseball Day Camp is to teach each camper the basic fundamentals of baseball through lecture, demonstration, and practice. Drill work in areas of catching, throwing, hitting, fielding, position play, and base running will be a part of each day. Activities incorporating fun and games are used to keep the intensity and enthusiasm high!

COST

- \$120.00 for Day Camp.
- Specialty Camp(s), \$60.00 each.
- A \$50.00 deposit must accompany application.

GENERAL

- Campers must provide their own gloves and should be dressed suitable for baseball participation. Label all items with name.
- Each camper will take home a camp T-shirt.
- Concessions stand open.
- Campers grouped according to age and skill level. Boys and girls, "rookies and veterans" are welcome at all camps!

STAFF

The camp will be under the direction of Barton College Head Baseball Coach Todd Wilkinson. Wilkinson played collegiate baseball at UNC-Chapel Hill. The Montreal Expos drafted him in 1984. He served as Assistant Director of the North Carolina Baseball Academy in Greensboro, teaching baseball to individuals and groups of all ages. He has directed and served in many capacities in numerous camps and clinics during his 20+ years of coaching experience. In January 2000, Wilkinson served as a clinician at the American Baseball Coaches Association annual convention speaking to over 3000 ABCA members on the topic of "Teaching Hitting Mechanics." Wilkinson has published instructional articles in the ABCA journal and Scholastic Coach and he is currently the Youth Swing Specialist classroom writer for www.hittingacademy.com. Wilkinson served as the Head Coach of the Wilson Tobs baseball team during the summer of 2004.

Former and current Barton players, current Wilson Tobs players and coaches, along with other head and assistant coaches from all levels of the game will complete the instructional staff.
