Transfer Application Information

BARTON COLLEGE SCHOOL OF HEALTH SCIENCES

The School of Nursing at Barton College was established in 1970, graduating the first class in 1974. In 2016, the nursing program was named the Judy Howard Hill Nursing Program in honor of Ms. Hill. She completed her nursing degree at the Lenoir Memorial Hospital School of Nursing in Kinston and her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Barton College in 1991. She would continue to earn a Master of Science in Nursing from Duke University and subsequently become a nurse practitioner serving many citizens in Lenoir and Wayne counties.

Today, the program offers the traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing, an online RN-to-Bachelor of Science in Nursing, and an online Master of Science in Nursing program. In 2022, Barton College established a School of Health Sciences. The School of Nursing was then absorbed into the new School of Health Sciences.

Clinical sites for nursing students are completed at various hospital and healthcare organizations across the area including Wilson Medical Center, UNC Health at Nash, Wayne, and Johnston, Duke University, WakeMed Health & Hospitals, and East Carolina University. Clinical days are assigned by the course instructors and are generally completed on Thursdays, Fridays, and/or Saturdays. Students receive their clinical schedule once classes start.

A competitive applicant to the Judy Howard Hill Nursing Program will have:

Completed admission to Barton College

If you are a transferring student from another college, you must first apply to Barton College, submit all **official college transcripts** and be accepted and deposited to the college through general admissions. Please see **Transfer Application at www.barton.edu/apply** to start the process and select the application for transfer students.

- Minimum GPA: 2.9
- Required prerequisites. **Please see the chart on reverse.** You will need the transfer equivalency to the listed Barton Courses. Students can transfer in courses from any accredited college or university. The NCCCS course equivalencies are only listed as a resource.
- Minimum Junior Status (52 credits or more)
